- **RECOVER** from our collective trauma and loss
- RESTORE the powerful and meaningful relationships that underpin the work we do
- **REBUILD** the structures, systems and supports necessary to meet the needs of our students
- RISE to the challenge of providing our students (without exception) with an education that will prepare them to achieve, succeed, and lead in our society

Funds for Learning Recovery

- ESSER (Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief) \$540,000
- ESSER II \$2.4 million
- ARP (American Rescue Plan) also known as ESSER III \$5.4 million
- These are in addition to our regular state and federal grants:
 - Title I
 - Title II
 - Title III
 - IDEA
 - Pre-K for All
 - Etc.
- Funding may be used over 3 years.

Learning Recovery Needs Assessment

(to be supported with ESSER and ARP (ESSER III)Funds)

- Physical Health & Safety for In-Person Learning
 - COVID precautions and protocols (including PPE and social distancing)
 - School sanitation and air purifiers
 - Bus monitors to support masking
- Social Emotional Health & Wellness
 - Social, emotional, & behavior supports
 - Social Emotional Learning Curriculum
 - Social Workers (1 additional per school)
- Digital Access & Instruction
 - One-to-one devices & internet access for all students and families



Learning Recovery Needs Assessment

(to be supported with ESSER and ARP (ESSER III)Funds

- Academic Needs for Learning Recovery
 - Reading/Writing (particular concern for grades K 4)
 - Vocabulary & Language Development (particular concern for Primary and ELs)
 - Listening & Critical Thinking
 - Math/Problem-Solving
 - Science
 - Social Studies/Social Emotional Learning
- In-Person Learning for All Students
- After School, Out of School & Home Learning
 - Extended Learning Time to address individual learning needs



Learning Recovery Needs Assessment

• Special Education Support for Students with Disabilities

- Bilingual Support & Language Development
- Family Support
- Experiential Deficits
 - On-site experiences/speakers
 - Field trips (Spring 2022)
- Teacher Professional Development & Planning to Meet Student Learning Needs
- Teacher Support

Use of ARP (ESSER III) Funds

- Supplemental curriculum supplies and materials for student use (PreK 8)
- School supplies, backpacks, water bottles for all students (1600 sets of supplies to start each year)
- Books and materials for school libraries
- Trade books for distribution to families (3 distributions per year x all students)
- Social Emotional Learning Curriculum for all grade levels (Second Step)
- Software and online subscription services to support technology use for inperson and remote learning (GoGuardian, Google Classroom, etc.)
- Technology devices, accessories, and internet access for students for in-person and remote learning (Laptops/iPads, chargers, cases, carts, hotspots)
- Intersession and After School Programs to address Learning Loss (Salary and stipends for staff members to lead programs, materials for student use)

Use of Funds continued . . .

- Additional School Social Workers (1 per school x 3 years)
- COVID Care Nurses (1 per school x 2 years)
- ABA Therapy Consultants (District-wide as needed)
- Professional Development (Summer, Institute Day, and after school professional development for teachers and staff)
- PPE, desk shields, hand sanitizing stations, and sanitizing supplies (all classrooms & offices)
- Sanitizing Staff (Day and evening staff at all schools)
- Bus monitors to Ensure Masking and Social Distancing (Monitors for Eisenhower, Madison and Coolidge buses)
- Air Purifiers (all classrooms, gyms, and student spaces)
- School and Community Safety Events (COVID testing, vaccination drives, staff pay)
